Greater Love in Christ Church

PREAMBLE

As Christ Jesus is the Lord of Love, peace and unity among us, this church accepts the following persuaded attitude of fellowship:

We have been led by the Holy Spirit to receive Jesus Christ as our personal Lord and Savior, and on the basis of our faith and his finished work of salvation, we thank God the Father that we can totally depend on, and trust in Him to accomplish his good, acceptable, and perfect will in us.

As we are empowered by the indwelling Holy Spirit, we seek to live our lives in conformity to God's will and word. As we walk in, and are led by the Holy Spirit, love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self control, will be evident in our lives. As such, our desire is to care for and counsel one another in the spirit of brotherly love, to pray for one another, to comfort and aid each other, and to practice the love of God as the natural result of being new creations in Jesus Christ.

According tot his understanding, we recognize that in Christ we are under grace and not obligated to law; and as such we owe no man anything but to love one another as Christ has loved us. Therefore, joined together by this Greater Love in Christ, we accept the unity of this fellowship in accomplishing the will of God; spreading and sharing the Gospel of Christ through all nations, contributing to the support of the ministry, the expenses of this church as it endeavors to relieve the poor and serve the community.

STATEMENT OF FAITH

We believe the following statements are derived from scripture:

- 1. The Bible is the inspired word of God, "...and contains all things necessary for salvation: whatever is not read within it nor may be proved by it is not to be required of anyone that it should be believed as an article of the faith or be thought required or necessary to salvation." and by the ministry of the Holy Spirit is the trustworthy rule of faith and life.

- 2. The Lord our God is one, the Eternal I Am, who graciously reveals himself personally in Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

- 3. We believe in the deity of our Lord Jesus Christ, in his virgin birth, in his sinless life, his miraculous works, in his vicarious and atoning death through his shed blood, in his bodily resurrection, in his ascension to the right hand of the father, and in his personal return with power and glory.

- 4. In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth. All things were made by Him; indeed, nothing was made without Him. It is the Father from whom all things came, the Son through whom all things were made, and the Spirit who gave order to that which was without form and void.

- 5. God created man, male and female, in his image and walked and talked with Him in the garden where man sinned, rejecting God's expressed will. This original sin has left man with a fallen nature at enmity with God and the rest of creation. This

fallen nature is evidenced by the fact that "all have sinned and come short of the Glory of God." Man, condemned by one man's sin stands lost in his unrighteousness and bound for hell, but has not been left without hope by God who loves him. By the grace of God through the righteousness of Jesus Christ, all men may be saved.

God in His Hold Love has called whosever will to salvation, which He has provided by sending his son Jesus to die on the cross in man's place, as an atonement for man's sin, and by raising Him up from the dead for our justification. To all who respond to God's call, recognizing their sinfulness, repent, and by faith wrought by the Holy Spirit, receive Jesus as their Savior, God gives eternal life. With the price for His sin paid by the spotless Lamb of God, he stands acquitted for Christ's sake, forgiven, cleansed, redeemed, reconciled – a new creation. This salvation cannot be earned for we are saved by the grace of God through faith and that not of ourselves it is the gift of God: not of works, lest any man shall boast.

God "has put all things under his feet and gave Him to be the head over all things in the church, which is His body, the fullness of Him that filleth all in all."
